PM Hot Tip: Inspections are an important part of property management as we are able to identify proactive maintenance which not only benefits the owner's asset but can maintain an enjoyable living environment for tenants.

PM Hot Tip: Remove mold from silicone seals in sinks and showers, follow these steps: Roll toilet paper along the silicone seal. Spray the silicone with mold cleaning spray until it's thoroughly wet. Leave it for at least an hour or two. Afterward, wipe away the mold and residue using a damp cloth.

The most rewarding aspect of being a property manager is the ability to create and maintain a positive living environment for tenants while ensuring the owner's investment is well-managed and aligned with their goals. The dynamic nature of the role keeps you on your toes, as no two days are the same!

PM Hot Tip: Regularly clean your air conditioner filters to improve airflow so your AC unit doesn't have to work as hard. Efficient operation of your AC not only extends its lifespan but also uses less energy, which can reduce your utility bills.

Community News

Our team of Indigenous Community Housing Officers (CHO's) and Housing Maintenance Officers (HMOs) conduct tenancy management and maintenance services across five communities - Yirrkala, Milingimbi, Ramingining, Gapuwiyak, and Galiwinku - to deliver our Living Strong Program.

Our CHO's duties include letter drops, inspections, connecting clients to essential services in the region, assisting clients in filling out paperwork and ensuring members attend Housing Reference Group Community meetings.

Our HMO's complete first-response repairs and maintenance within public housing assets, keeping tenants safe.

Sharon and Brendan oversee the execution of this. Whilst they work from our head office, they are always travelling remotely to support our remote offices.

Sharon assists our Community Housing Officers and Brendan supports and trains our Housing Maintenance Officers.

Our team has recently started loaning equipment such as mops, rakes and brooms to help tenants maintain their homes. Additionally, we have started to encourage all community members over the age of 18 to lodge their housing applications to best prepare for future living.

We have noticed a big difference in living conditions with our CHO's working with the families. Although these conversations can be challenging due to conflicts, our local staff effectively manage to collaborate with families within their communities.
